your honey produce and hear experts talk about Bee related topics and answer your questions.



Plants for Bees published by IBRA 2012 In 1945 Dr F. N. Howes, a Professional Botanist, published "Plants and Beekeeping". "Plants for Bees" is a recently published successor to that book, now expanded by Dr William.D.J.Kirk. The book contains beautiful colour pictures throughout. There are chapters not only on honey bees but also solitary and bumble bees and a catalogue of flowering plants both cultivated and wild with which the Gardener will attract and benefit bee species. There is a wealth of information on each plant: its cultivation, season, types of bee attracted to it and for most species a colour picture of the flower and for some its pollen grain. At £25.00 it is not cheap, but as a reference book it is unbeatable and worthy of a place in every Branch library

Winter losses

The winter losses of colonies in 2012—2013 were unprecedented across most of the country according to the BBKA Winter Survival Survey. Losses were double those of 2011/12. On average 33.8 % of colonies were lost countrywide with the Northern region being hardest hit with 46.4% losses. These were calculated from a survey of BBKA members measuring the numbers of colonies going into winter at October 1st 2012 compared with the number of colonies alive at 31st March 2013.

As the cold wet weather continued for at least another 6 weeks one can assume that losses were even higher in our area. Poor summer weather in 2012 with little forage and poor Queen mating led to dwindling Autumn colonies and Drone layers throughout the Spring. The late show of flowers exacerbated the situation and it is only in the last six weeks that most local beekeepers have been seeing strong hives with more normal brood patterns and nectar storage.
