Annual General Meeting Cumbria Beekeepers Association

Held on 6th March at Southey St Methodist Hall Keswick The numbers attending this year were small again, but those who made the trip were rewarded with a demonstration of the Projector, laptop and digital Microscope attachments which are now available for any of the CBKA Branches to borrow. Walter, who was the driving force in obtaining the grant for this equipment had set up the system and ran through the sequence for it's use in talks, and bee disease recognition through microscopy slide projection. There will be a guidance sheet for users to accompany the equipment when out on loan. It is hoped that members will put their contributions such as talks and slide shows aimed at a variety of audiences (Schools, W.I.s , Youth Groups, other beekeepers etc) onto the hard drive for others to use.

Following that, Christine Matthews presented a guide to the benefits and disadvantages of taking out insurance with the BDI. This clear and concise presentation answered a lot of the questions that we have had about BDI and allowed the members to make an informed choice when it came to the propositions.

Foulbrood outbreak hits Stranraer

American Foulbrood (AFB) has been confirmed by the Scottish government at one hive in the Stranraer area. An infected area has been declared 5km (3 miles) around the apiary involved, prohibiting the movement of bees or equipment in or out of the area

Foulbrood is caused by a bacterium getting inside bee larvae and using up their food supplies, starving them to death. Hives with AFB cannot be treated with antibiotics and have to be destroyed. There were outbreaks of the disease and European Foulbrood (EFB) in Perthshire last year. The Scottish government is currently working on a control strategy for the diseases. There is no public health risk from the outbreak.
