Training for Trainers

October 23rd Edge Hill University Ormskirk

BBKA and FERA ran the first of four Training Days at Edge Hill University on Saturday 23rd. The event was very well attended by a tranche of Northern Beekeepers. Martin Smith President of BBKA ran the day and introduced the second "Course in a Case". This is the yellow one for teaching Novices (following the White one for Beginners) The plan is for five more Course in a Case modules and each Association will be able to buy these as they roll out, at cost price. The Beginners Course for Cumbria is in the care of the Secretary, Stephen Barnes for those of you who wish to borrow and use it. It contains a variety of teaching aids including notes, DVDs, pictures, and mock frames with representations of brood development as well as feedback forms.

The day included talks on resources for beginners courses, presentation methods, teaching recognition, apiary organisation and safety in the apiary The need and reason for the BBKA examination structure was fully explained although there seemed to be some differences of opinion about future developments. The day was absolutely full starting at 9.30 but there was time at the excellent lunch to talk bees.

Report on CBKA Annual Honey Show and Conference.

The Annual Honey Show and Conference was held at Threlkeld Village Hall on Saturday 13th November. After welcoming everyone Nick Mills President of CBKA introduced John Crouch, the well known Cumbrian Chef, who demonstrated several dishes cooked with honey, including red cabbage with cranberries (perfect for Christmas) and a delicious mild curry. Following his demonstration there was time for tasting the dishes before lunch, also cooked by John Crouch. The Honey Show entries were down in number but according to the Judge Bill Mackereth not in quality. Kendal beekeepers almost swept the board with Rachel Blocksidge winning several trophies. New comer Marguerite Hopkins won a trophy for most points in the baking classes and Stephen Barnes, Cumbria BKA Secretary, won the best exhibit in show with his perfect frame of honey suitable for extraction.

Following lunch the Branch reports revealed a difficult year for most beekeepers with colonies requiring feed in the middle of summer and poor honey crops for most. All Branches reported increased membership, reflecting the great interest in beekeeping.

The Seasonal Bee Inspector, Stewart Beattie, gave his report, concluding that although at present the Foul brood outbreaks seem to have been contained, he thinks many beekeepers are still not tackling their Varroa infestations well enough.

The afternoon Speaker was Margaret Thomas, Moderator for the BBKA examination Board, Master beekeeper. She gave a most instructive talk on Queen rearing for small scale beekeeping (not as she pointed out Queen Breeding) with plenty of diagrams to illustrate techniques. There is a synopsis of her talk included in this CBT, but all her notes will be available from the editor by email.

Margaret Thomas kindly presented the trophies for the honey show, before the closing remarks by the President Nick Mills.
